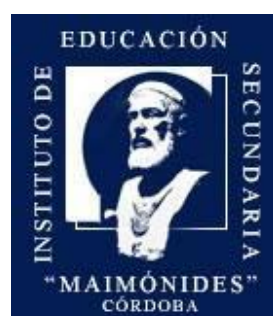

<p>Getting to school / Getting around Córdoba</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How to get to school and around Córdoba: <p>At the heart of Córdoba lies IES Maimónides, your future workplace. It is located near the Roman Temple and the Town Hall building, making it easy to access and explore the city on foot. If you need to venture further, there are several transportation options available.</p> <p>Radio Taxi Cordoba: +34 957 76 44 44 Uber is operating in Cordoba too.</p> <p>If you're interested in using public buses, check out https://www.aucorsa.es/. It includes schedules and information on the main public transport companies. A monthly pass or a Bono-Bus Card would be the best option if you plan on using the city buses frequently.</p> <p>Driving in Córdoba can be a challenge due to the city's many pedestrian streets and the difficulty of parking, especially in the Jewish neighborhood and Mosque's surroundings. However, if you're up for an adventure, consider renting a bike or an electric scooter. With over 70 km of bike lanes and a flat terrain, Córdoba is ideal for exploring on two wheels.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How to get to Córdoba: <div data-bbox="443 1608 853 1863">  </div> <p>Getting to Córdoba is also easy, as it is part of Spain's major highway and railway network. The city also has an airport, although it is not currently served by commercial airlines and is exclusively used for private air traffic and charter planes.</p> <p>Traveling by train (https://www.renfe.com/es/es) is the most convenient and</p>

<p>Accommodation</p>	<p>most rapid way of getting to Cordoba. The city is part of the national high speed train network allowing travel times of less than two hours to Madrid and 45 minutes to Seville. There is an hourly AVE high-speed train service that stops in Cordoba, a highspeed rail line connects Cordoba to the coastal city of Malaga. and direct high-speed rail service is offered between Córdoba and Granada.</p> <p>Check out (https://www.estacionautobusescordoba.es/) if you prefer to take the bus. We hope this information will help you get around Córdoba with ease and enjoy all that this beautiful city has to offer. See you soon!</p> <p>You can find many housing opportunities in Córdoba. 1. Be the hero in our bilingual teachers' journey! We need you to chat with them in English all the time to help them improve. They are teachers of various subjects such as History, Maths, Technology, Natural Sciences, etc, who teach in English. Your constant support will help them bring the language to life in the classroom and keep our bilingual program efficient.
2. Help us find and adapt the best resources for our students. Whether it's from books or the internet, your resourceful skills will be put to the test!
3. Interact with our students! You'll assist our English teachers in planning activities, role plays, games, and more to help students improve their language and cultural awareness. Feel free to bring in some items related to your country to share in class, and we can even celebrate a national festival together.
4. Join the fun! You'll be a part of our extracurricular activities, including workshops, field trips, student exchanges, music and theater performances, and sport events.
5. Be a reading role model! You'll be the go-to person for native speaker reading.
6. Keep the bilingual project going! You're here to help us keep the project moving forward.
7. You're one of us! As a member of our staff, you'll have full access to our staff room and classroom resources.

Miscellaneous

1. **Your working hours** (12 hours a week) will be spread out across different days and will depend on the schedules of the teachers you'll be working with. You'll have a weekly day off either on Mondays or Fridays to explore the city.
2. You'll be working with **several teachers** who teach different subjects.
3. **Classes** start at 8:15 am, with three lessons in a row, a half an hour break and three more lessons until 2:45 pm.
4. You'll be assisting **students of all ages and levels**, not just one particular class year.
5. There's **no strict dress code** in Spanish public schools, as long as you dress appropriately. It's recommended to take note of what other teachers are wearing.

6. We'll keep you updated on the **first day procedures** closer to the starting day.
7. The **academic year** is divided into three terms, and we'll let you know the vacation days so you can plan accordingly.
8. You'll be joined by **two more language assistants**, which will be a great experience for you all.
9. The **visa process** may take a few weeks (sometimes longer), but we'll be here to help you through it. Keep us updated on your visa progress!
10. **Let us get to know you!** Please send us your personal and professional background to the bilingual program coordinator, including any previous education experience.
11. **Keep us in the loop on your arrival date in Cordoba.** You'll be starting on October 1st and finishing on May 31st.
12. While searching for a place to stay, know that **the historic center is a great location to live** - you are right where the action occurs. Live in beautiful, red-tiled Spanish-style homes with intricately decorated interior community patios, balconies bursting with flowers, and even the occasional roof-top terraces. Maimonides could be just a short walk from your doorstep living in the historic center.
13. Also, **mark your calendars for May** because the city comes alive when the Patios celebration begins. Once spring gets in motion, the smell of flowers permeates the air and people from all over come to see Cordoba in bloom. Who knows, maybe you will win the award for best balcony or best patio in Cordoba!
14. If you crave a more modern experience perhaps you will find success finding **an apartment in Ciudad Jardin**. If you can guess by the name, this neighborhood also abounds with flowers and greenery but with some more modern conveniences.
15. Lastly, don't hesitate to reach out to us for any assistance you may need before coming. **We can't wait to meet you!**
